National Institute of Technology, Tiruchirappalli (NITTrichy) founded in 1964 is a public technical and research university in Tamil Nadu, India. It is one of India's oldest technical universities and is located at Tiruchirappalli in a campus of 800 acres. The university is recognized as an Institute of National Importance by the Government of India. The university focuses exclusively on science, technology, engineering, management, architecture and humanities. National Institutional Ranking Framework ranked the university 1st among the NITs in India in 2023. Our goal is to align science and technology education with the holistic vision outlined in NEP 2020 so that together we can create a framework that fosters multidisciplinarity and prepares learners to engage meaningfully with the complexities of the modern world.
